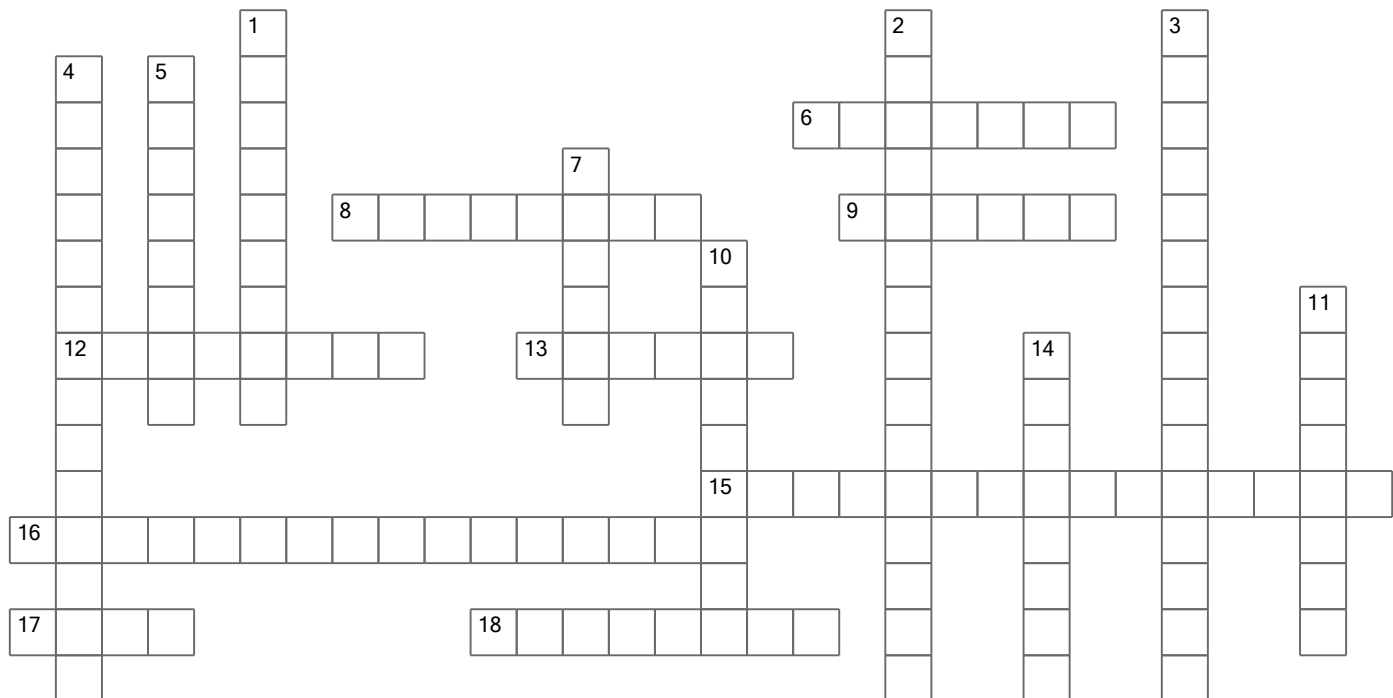

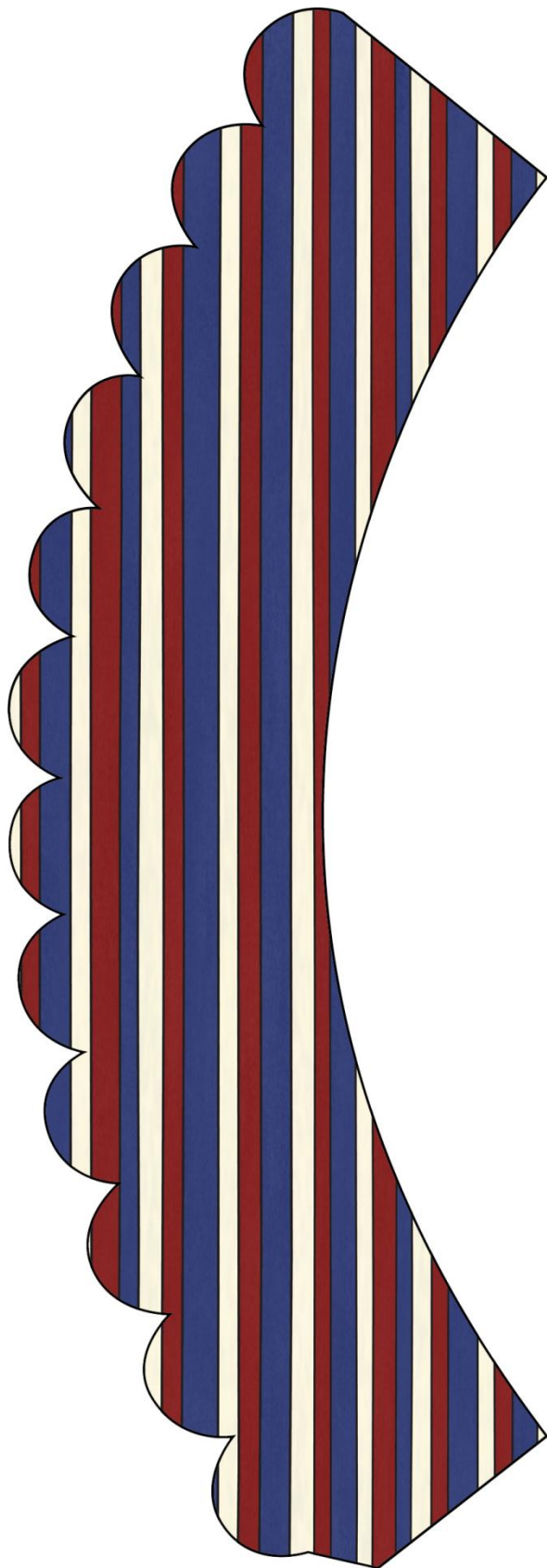
1. Print on cardstock or construction paper.

Election Day Cupcake Wrapper and Topper



Cupcake wrapper:

1. Cut out wrapper.
2. Apply glue to tab to paste the ends together.

Cupcake topper:

1. Cut out topper pieces.
2. Glue back to back inserting toothpick in between.
